Our mission is to get more people playing, learning and growing together in the great outdoors.

Wildlings is a Singapore outdoor education company built on the Forest School ethos. We run two private nature sites, at Dempsey Hill and on City Sprouts Farm in West Coast Park, and deliver programmes across the island in locations such as Pulau Ubin, Changi and Pasir Ris Park, and at partner venues chosen to fit each school's objectives and able to deliver to the standard they expect, in line with their policies and procedures.

Our programmes are built on eight years of experience running outdoor education in Singapore. For preschools and primary schools we run curriculum-aligned excursions and learning journeys at our own sites and in the wider outdoors. For primary and lower secondary year groups we design and deliver overnight camps and multi-day residentials. Schools also work with us on weekly Forest School CCAs. Programmes have been built to meet IB Primary Years Programme units of inquiry, the UK and Singapore national curricula and Scout badge requirements.

A residential with Wildlings takes the hassle out of running one. You work with one company that designs and delivers the programme, secures the venues, catering and accommodation, holds the permits and runs the logistics, from the first planning call to the post-camp debrief.



Residential track record

Wildlings has designed and delivered overnight camps and residentials for renowned international schools in Singapore, including:

- Three-day, two-night residentials for hundreds of primary children across Pulau Ubin, the Changi coast and our own sites, with further camps booked for January 2027.
- Two-day outdoor programmes with school sleepover for a full year group of eight classes, delivered for the third consecutive year.
- Overnight camps at Wildlings Dempsey for primary classes, repeated year on year by the same schools.

How a Wildlings programme is built

Every Wildlings outdoor education programme draws on four foundations: Forest School principles, our outdoor education objectives, careful consideration of the Singapore environment, and compliance.



FOREST SCHOOL PRINCIPLES

1 DURATION

Forest School is a long-term process of frequent (weekly or bi-weekly) and regular sessions (24 weeks a year). It is not a one-off visit. Planning, adaptation, observations and reviewing are integral elements of Forest School. Sessions should be 2hrs in duration or longer.

2 LOCATION

Forest School takes place in a woodland or natural wooded environment with trees to support the development of a relationship between the learner and the natural world. There should be ample space in which to explore and discover. The environment is sustainable, and uses natural resources to inspire.

3 HOLISTIC

Forest School aims to nurture the physical, emotional, social, and cognitive development of participants, providing opportunities for learning and growth in all areas of their lives.

4 RISK AND CHALLENGE

Forest School provides opportunities for participants to develop practical skills and to take appropriate risks, building resilience, self-esteem, and developing skills in risk management. Participants learn how to assess and manage risk in a supportive and safe environment.

5 COMPETENT ADULTS

Forest School is run by qualified Forest School practitioners who continuously maintain and develop their professional practice. There is a high ratio of practitioners and adults to learners. Staff are child safeguarding trained and First Aid qualified.

6 LEARNER-CENTRED

Forest School uses a range of learner-centred processes to create a community for development and learning. Play and choice are an integral part of the Forest School learning process, and play is recognised as vital to learning and development at Forest School.

Outdoor education objectives

Five objectives shape every programme we design, this residential included.

1 TEAMWORK AND COLLABORATION

To cultivate a supportive and inclusive outdoor learning environment that emphasises teamwork, collaboration, and fellowship. Our programme aims to instil a sense of encouragement among participants, promoting the principle of 'challenge by choice' to ensure every individual has the opportunity to thrive based on their own merits and contributions to the team.

2 SOCIAL SKILLS DEVELOPMENT

To enhance social competencies and self-awareness through outdoor educational experiences. Our curriculum is designed to foster independence in children, gradually shifting reliance from adults to peers, thereby strengthening interpersonal skills. Through interactive activities, students will learn to navigate social contexts with confidence and empathy.

3 LEADERSHIP AND CHARACTER BUILDING

To develop emerging leaders equipped with strength of character and sound judgment. Our programme offers structured opportunities for students to assume leadership roles, make decisions, and face dilemmas, thereby shaping individuals who are prepared to lead with integrity and a sense of responsibility towards themselves and others.

4 ENVIRONMENTAL CONNECTION AND LITERACY

To deepen students' connection with the natural world, promoting environmental awareness and literacy. Through immersive experiences in nature, our programme encourages an understanding, appreciation, and connection with the environment. Students will engage in activities that highlight the significance of responsibility and conservation, fostering a lifelong commitment to protecting and valuing the great outdoors.

5 RESILIENCE AND PERSONAL ACHIEVEMENT

To build resilience and a mindset geared towards overcoming adversity. Our approach incorporates risky play and challenge, enabling students to set personal goals and face challenges at their own pace. This objective focuses on cultivating a sense of achievement and pride upon reaching success, reinforcing the importance of perseverance, adaptability, and mental toughness in the face of obstacles.

Built for Singapore

Heat and humidity: locations and timings chosen so children stay comfortable, with shade, water and rest built into every block.

Hazards: mosquito control, hazard talks before every excursion, and only sites with active tree management.
